In all, sixty players from four different teams representing London, Calgary, Winnipeg and Toronto, took part in the three-day event (August 3 to 6) at Humber College in Toronto.

Scott, who is assistant coach for the team beams with pride: "I'm so proud of these guys and all the participants who put on such a fantastic tournament. It's always nice to give back to the community and as coach, I get to do that. If anyone would like to know more about the league my door is always open," he says.

The Allied Cup is on permanent display at the Hockey Hall of Fame. The CEWHA has been operating in Canada for over 27 years. Their mission is to provide a quality hockey program for all persons with disabilities who have limited upper body strength and/or mobility, who could significantly benefit from the use of an electric wheelchair in competitive sport and daily living.

They believe that competition and challenge are healthy and necessary aspects of human nature. The CEWHA was formed to provide quality, well organized, recreation and social programs to a specific segment of the community.

The program is open to all persons with disabilities regardless of age or sex, who meet the criteria outlined in their mission statement. They provide an atmosphere of fun for players to improve their game skills while being part of a team where everyone is treated with dignity and respect.

The CEWHA is more than just a hockey league. It is a social organization that organizes social events for the players, their families, and volunteers. These include pizza nights, and various fund raising events. At the end of each season there's an Annual Awards Banquet where trophies are awarded.
